THE MCGIVNEY PROJECT

Sponsored by Holy Trinity Knights of Columbus Council of the Palms 6673, in conjunction with Catholic Charities, The McGivney Project helps Catholic Charities, The McGivney Project helps house the homeless and gives them incentives to build themselves up within a year to full participation in society. How? Catholic Charities will manage an account set up by our Knights to screen families and select the neediest. The operation annual cost is \$9,200. With this funding, Catholic Charities will be able to help more than one family at a time. A lease signed between the family and apartment management. A 2-bedroom family and apartment management. A 2-bedroom apartment will be \$530, and a 3-bedroom apartment will be \$760. Utilities will be in the tenant's name and will be their responsibility. The first 3 months the Knights will pay 100% of the rent. The next three months, the Knights will pay 75%, and the tenants will pay 25%. Months six through nine, the tenant will pay 50% of the rent, and the last three months the tenant will be responsible for 75% of the rent, and the Knights will contribute 25%. Similar to the LINC Project. responsible for 75% of the rent, and the Knights will contribute 25%. Similar to the LINC Project, Knights will collect donations of furnishings, clothing, food, and supplies to help set up new temporary housing. The Director for this worthy project is John Smith, and a Chairman appointed from the Knights of Columbus will organize obtaining the furniture and food for the household.

This is a way for the Knights to help more homeless families find necessary housing. This is a way for parishioners to help the needy by contributing on an ongoing basis to brothers and sisters in need.
